Student Retention Coordinators

The Student Retention Coordinators work with a working group made up of educators, social counselors, and an elder. They are gathering information and strategies that they will use to support communities in their efforts to keep children in school.

Florence Sanderson: I come from Lac Seul First Nation. I worked at Pelican Falls First Nations High School for many years as a social counsellor. My husband and I have 4 grown children and 4 grandchildren. I enjoy working with youth, spending time with family, travel, fishing, cooking (sometimes for really large groups) and reading.

Chelsea Berringer: Most of my experience has been working with youth in trouble with the law, mainly in secure custody. I have moved from Thunder Bay to join the team here in Sioux Lookout.

9:45 Small Steps to Reading – Phonological Awareness

Speech Pathologists: Theresa Le and Daina Kelly of Firefly (formerly Lake of the Woods Child Development Centre)

This presentation will review phonological awareness development, the basic foundational skill children need in learning how to read. These skills allow children to become aware that letters/sounds can be manipulated in a way that new words can be created, and that a word itself can be manipulated to create a new word. Phonological Awareness topics include rhyming, blending and segmenting words, syllables and sounds.
